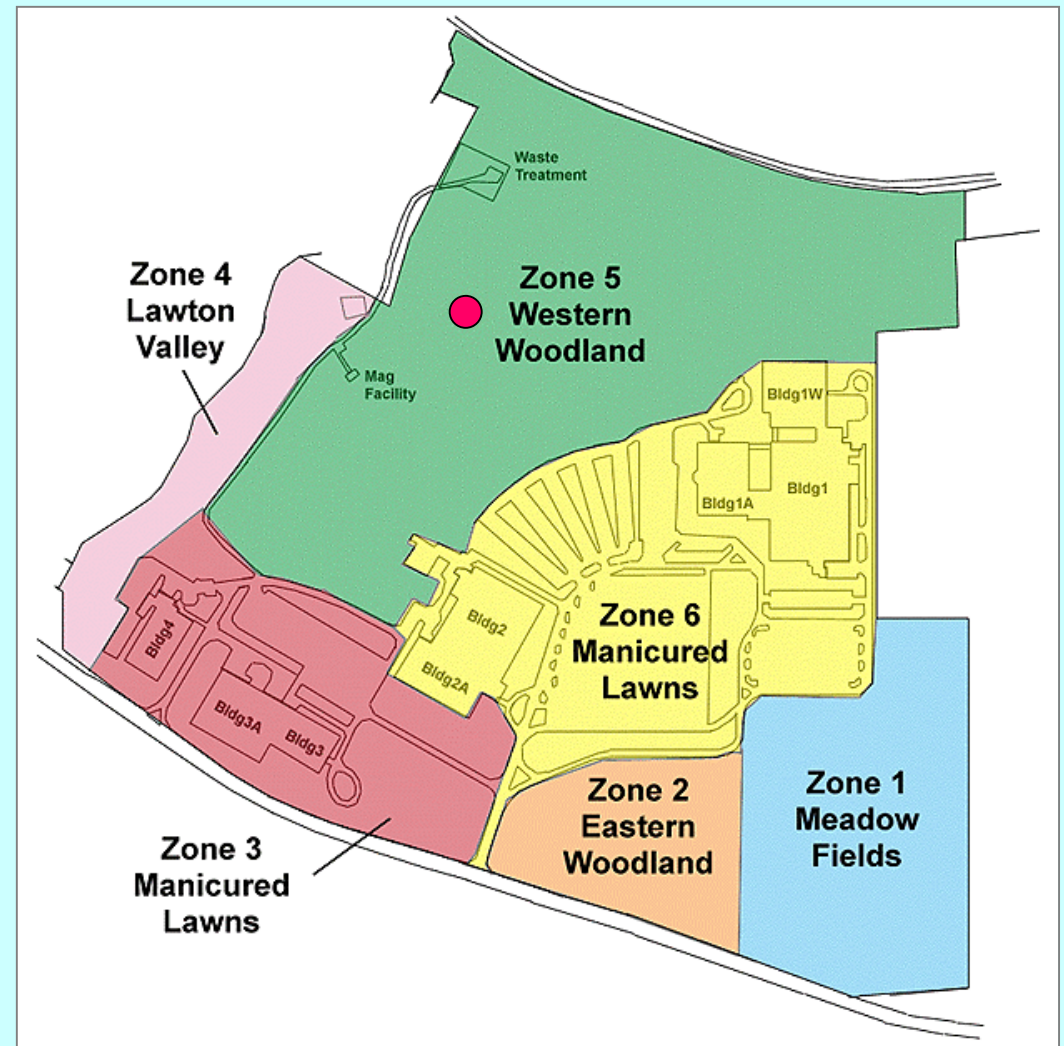

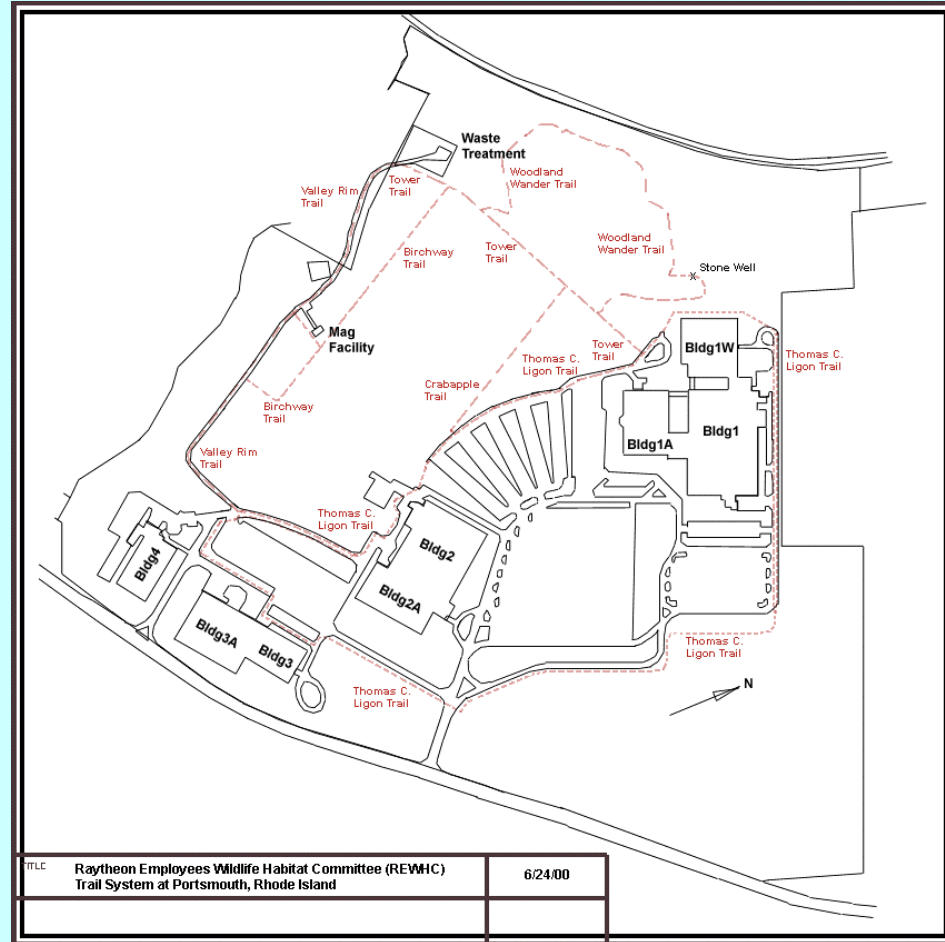
Interpretive Trail System
